3. A Message from Wellbeing



Brook work with Year 10

This week sexual health service Brook visited Treviglas Academy to work with our year 10 students. The session focused on educating year 10 students about contraceptives. The workshop introduced students to the range of contraceptives and how they function. Moreover, Brook explained the difference between barriers and birth control and offered students the opportunity to see them firsthand.

Our aim of this session was to equip students with important knowledge so that they can make responsible choices throughout their lives. To support this type of work, we continue to work with outside agencies to enrich our PSHE curriculum.

7. Miss Quarton - Humanities

The Humanities Faculty were really proud to take Y8 to the Eden Project twice this week, with half of the year group visiting on Wednesday and the other half on Thursday. The students engaged really well with the workshops which covered a range of important geographical topics including Fair Trade, Plant Adaptations, the Coffee Trade and Climate Change. The students spent time in groups looking at a number of activities in the Core, before visiting the Rainforest Biome to complete worksheets. Students also spent some free time in the Mediterranean Biome. On the whole they were less keen on the smells of the some of the strange fruit they experienced, however, we think Mr Senese quite liked it! Thank you to the Year 8 students and to the Eden Project staff for their guidance!

8. Miss Drake – Year 11 Family Learning Event

It was wonderful to welcome so many of our Year 11 parents to our Family Learning Event on Wednesday 22nd March.

Mrs Dunleavy shared with parents how we are setting the revision that students need to complete, ahead of their GCSE exams, as homework on Satchel. If students, therefore, complete all of the homework that we set, then they will have effectively revised for their exams. Mrs Dunleavy spoke to parents about the importance of wellbeing, rest and rewards, including the rewards programme that we have set up in school.
