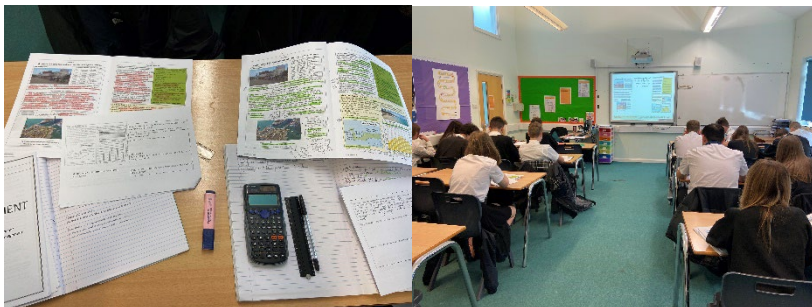

Humanities: Geography

Year 11 Geographers are working hard on the issue evaluation section for their Paper 3: Geographical applications. This section contributes to the critical thinking and problem solving element of the GCSE and provides students with the opportunity to demonstrate geographical skills and applied knowledge and understanding by looking at a current, real world issue using secondary sources. This year the geographers have to evaluate whether the Cayman Islands should be allowing the construction of a new port and cruise liner facility to enable further growth in the tourism industry there. Students have previously learnt how tourism can be used as a strategy to create economic growth and subsequent improvements in development and standards of living but can also bring social, economic and environmental disadvantages. Students will use this prior learning to analyse the information in the pre-release booklet in lessons over the next two weeks to prepare them to be able to answer questions on the issue in the June Exam.
