#### **SEND** policies

All students at Treviglas benefit from one hour a week of music lessons, exploring singing, keyboard, guitars and percussion across a range of musical styles from several cultures and periods in time. Lessons are largely practical, with a strong emphasis upon students becoming increasingly skilled and confident in understanding, playing and enjoying music. This may be in large whole class ensembles, smaller groups, pairs or individual work.

Students who opt for music at GCSE are offered the AQA GCSE Music course.

We work closely with ASONE, who create several wonderful opportunities for our students to make music and work alongside professionals. We always take full advantage of any opportunity to welcome musicians into Treviglas to lead workshops and offer performances. ALL year nine students are given the opportunity to see music performed live.

Treviglas is a Music Mark school, awarded in recognition of its extensive provision and range of opportunities for music.

## Part B: music tuition

This is about opportunities for pupils to sing and play music, outside of lesson time, including choirs, ensembles and bands, and how pupils can make progress in music beyond the core curriculum.

We are proud to work with Cornwall Music Service Trust (CMST) in offering musical tuition to our students beyond their timetabled lessons. As such, students are able to access small group lessons in guitars, piano, percussion, strings and brass. These lessons come at a cost (though some students may be entitled to subsidies). We work closely with ASONE, who create several wonderful opportunities for our students to make music and work alongside professionals. We always take full advantage of any opportunity to welcome musicians into Treviglas to lead workshops and offer performances.

Treviglas benefits from a suite of rehearsal rooms which our musicians are able to take full advantage of during break times and after school.

# **Part C: Musical experiences**

This is about all the other musical events and opportunities that we organise, such as singing in assembly, concerts and shows, and trips to professional concerts.

We are incredibly proud of the opportunities for our students to perform music.

We have several clubs, including samba, steel pans, singing club and productions, where students can immerse themselves in their love of music. We have several student led bands whom we support and offer mentoring to. Students are also able to take advantage of the areas facilities to develop their compositional skills and coursework.

To celebrate our students' many musical abilities, we offer a range of performance opportunities. These include regular 'pop up' performances in the school hall over lunch breaks, an annual 'Winter festival' at the end of the Autumn term, an annual variety show, 'Band Nights' (most recently on Lusty Glaze beach), community performances whenever they are available and appearances in regional and national festivals such as Great Estate, Boardmasters and Camp Bestival.

Events in school usually come at a nominal cost to parents, built all funds raised are reinvested in performing arts.

# In the future
