This Week's Treviglas Focus – Routines

1. A Message from the Headteacher

Healthy routines for young people help them to concentrate on their learning because they bring structure and predictability to their world and prevent them experiencing the pressure associated with sudden change.

Mrs Drake and Mr Rogers talked about our new routines in Monday's Briefing. Staff can look back to the notes from the Briefing that were sent out to all staff on Tuesday afternoon. Find time to speak with other members of staff about these routines so we are all secure in our knowledge of them. Our consistent approach to our routines will provide all our students with a school where they enjoy their learning.

2. Mrs Drake – Teaching and Learning

Responsive teaching is something that we aim to achieve in every lesson where we check for understanding and act upon the information so that the content that is taught is understood and able to be applied. Our goal is to ensure that the gap is as small as possible between what is taught by us, as subject experts, and learnt by students. It is important to check the understanding of all students in the class so that gaps in knowledge, understanding and skills are not widened.

This week, we have been developing our use of show me boards in lessons. The 'Show Me Boards' Walkthru details the five steps that we should go through in lessons to effectively use this resource. However, our focus must always be upon what we do with the information, following this checking for understanding. We should constantly reflect upon where we need to address misconceptions, reteach information or set up a guided group while the rest of the class move onto practising and developing their learning. After briefing next week, the focus of the Teaching and Learning Forum will be upon strategies to check for understanding and all are welcome to join the discussion.

3. Miss Dandy – Geography

Year 9 are currently exploring Natural Hazards. This half-term the focus has been on volcanoes and earthquakes. Students have used case study examples of the Chilean Earthquake of 2010 and the Nepalese Earthquake of 2015 to compare the primary and secondary effects, responses and how economic disparities increase the effects. Students have also studied the important role Iceland's volcanic activity places in geothermal technology. After half-term students will continue on the topic of Natural Hazards, with a focus on Typhoon Haiyan, 2013.

Spaceport Cornwall - On Friday 26th, 50 year 7 students had the opportunity to tour the Virgin Orbit Launcher One at Spaceport Cornwall. The students enjoyed learning about the launch, why Newquay was selected and the opportunities for space careers. When the talk and tour was over, students headed back to school and worked in

pairs to create a newsletter about their visit. Miss Dandy, Mr Hargreaves and Mr Maule were really impressed with the students and it was the perfect end to a brilliant half-term.
