### **ACADEMY DRESS CODE**

We are proud of our uniform which reflects our high standards of appearance at all times. The school expects every student to maintain these standards, both when in school and representing the school in public.

Every student at Treviglas Academy is expected to wear the full uniform, which is deliberately kept as simple and reasonably priced as possible.

Students attending our post-16 centre are expected to dress in appropriate clothing of their own choice.

We do not feel that school is an appropriate place for extremes of fashion, whether in clothing, shoes, hair-styles, jewellery, make-up, nail varnish or general appearance. Consequently, students who do not adhere to the school's policy on uniform will be spoken to by staff and will be required to make the necessary changes to their dress or appearance. We expect full support from parents in making Treviglas Academy a calm and equable place and reserve the right to make the final decision in such matters.

Uniform may be purchased from Macron Store / Macron Store Sports which has now moved to Unit 8a, A30 Business Park, Lodge Way, Indian Queens, TR9 6FZ; online or at the welcome to Year 7 evening. Please note that school blazers, sweatshirts, PE shirts, rugby shirts and ties are only available from the Macron store.

### **Dress Code:**

V-neck black sweatshirt with the Treviglas logo and/or black blazer with embroidered logo. Students need to have at least one of these garments with them in school; they do not have to have both.





- White shirt with either short or long sleeves, tucked in at all times. Top button to be fastened.
- Striped tie (available from Macron)
- Black appropriate length pleated formal skirt or formal tailored full-length trousers or formal tailored shorts. Straight skirts or lycra fitted skirts are not acceptable. Mini skirts are not acceptable. Jersey fabric is not acceptable. Jeans, leggings, tight/skinny trousers, turn ups, cargos, or tracksuit style trousers are not acceptable. (Please note the request for the skirt to be pleated is from September 2023)







- Plain black tights or ankle socks (no logos).
- ❖ Flat formal black leather or leather look shoe (not boots) with a stepped heel. No coloured laces, brand logos or markings. No canvas fabric. Some shops market casual black school shoes that do not meet our uniform code as school shoes. Having a stepped heel is a distinguishing feature of a formal shoe. Please purchase with care and, if in doubt, ask. (Please note the request for the shoe to have a stepped heel is from September 2023.)

If you are in doubt about the shoe, it is likely not the right shoe.

- Students can wear a plain black narrow belt with a plain buckle.
- Outdoor Coat. This should be a suitable waterproof or warm coat for the winter months. Hoodies, sweatshirts or other non-uniform jumpers are not an alternative to a winter or waterproof coat. Students wearing these will be asked to leave them in reception.
- Outdoor garments, such as gloves and hats, should not be worn indoors.
- ❖ JEWELLERY AND HAIRSTYLES Hair should be tidy and of a natural colour. Long hair will need to be tied back when requested for health and safety reasons. Unnatural colours and extreme hairstyles are not permitted. Students should not be noticeably wearing make-up and nail varnish or false nails should not be worn. Wearing decorative jewellery is unsafe and inappropriate in a modern, active school environment. Students may wear one pair of small, plain ear studs. Any other jewellery is not permitted and, if it is worn, it will be confiscated, put in an envelope and logged for collection from reception. In the first instance, the student can collect it themselves at the end of the school day. If the issue is persistent then parents will be asked to collect the items. All jewellery must be removed for PE lessons and hair must be tied back. Body piercing of any other type is not permitted. Please note that the school reserves the right to make the final decision as to the appropriateness of dress, jewellery, make up and hairstyle.
- Please note valuables such as jewellery and phones brought into school are at your own risk.

# PE Kit information on next page

- Sports and Activities Kit. We ask all parents to support the academy by ensuring that all students have the correct Sports and Activities kit, the details of which are below. Only school kit should be worn for sports and activities. It is expected that every student will have the correct uniform and be able to take a full part in all Sports and Activities sessions.
  - Black Treviglas Academy sports PE t shirt
  - Black shorts of suitable length or plain black tracksuit trousers or black sports leggings
  - Black sports socks
  - Trainers with non-marking soles and football boots.

We recommend a windbreak for the colder months.

- Treviglas rugby shirt
- Gumshield for rugby (advisable)
- Shinpads for football and hockey (advisable)

# Note:

Specific team kit may be required for those specialising or representing the academy in summer sports e.g. whites for cricket or tennis; athletics vests, running shoes; dance kit.

Students will be required to bring PE kit to every session, regardless of injury or illness.

All items of clothing and kit should be clearly marked with the owner's name.
